

March 19 - First day of Spring!

PIRS Did you know? According to the National Weather Service, the Equinoxes – Vernal & Autumnal, are the "only two times of the year when the Earth's axis is tilted neither toward nor away from the sun, resulting in a "nearly" equal amount of daylight and darkness at all latitudes. These events are referred to as Equinoxes. The word "equinox" is derived from two Latin words - aequus (equal) and nox (night). At the equator, the sun is directly overhead at noon on these two equinoxes. The "nearly" equal hours of day and night is due to the refraction

of sunlight i.e., bending or the light's rays, that causes the sun to appear above the horizon when the actual position of the sun is below the horizon. Additionally, the days become a little longer at the higher latitudes because it takes the sun longer to rise and set. Therefore, on the equinox and for several days before and after, the length of day will range from about 12hrs and 6.5 min. at the equator to 12hrs and 8 min. at 30 degrees latitude to 12hrs and 16 mins at 60 degrees latitude." For us here in this region, we'll have a whopping 12 hrs and 8 minutes of daylight on this day and it will get longer from there! A welcome sign that the full-on boating season is approaching!



March 31 - Easter. It's early this year! Easter falls on the first Sunday after the Paschal Full Moon, i.e., the first full moon after the vernal equinox. Yet another "Did you know? So, whether you celebrate it or not, have some chocolate eggs and enjoy the day!



ADVANCED GRADES

Boat Handling: How the heck do I get this boat to do what I want?

Marine Navigation (aka Piloting): How to get from here to there without running into something.

Advanced Marine Navigation (aka Advanced Piloting): Navigation under more difficult circumstances while using electronic tools, especially GPS all the while taking wind and currents into account.

Off-shore Navigation (aka Junior Navigation or JN): When off-shore there are no longer landmarks for reference; we must substitute celestial objects such as the sun.

Celestial Navigation (aka Navigation or N): The final navigation course focuses on sextant use---for when all your electronics fail!

ELECTIVES

Cruising and Cruise Planning: You're going on a two-week cruise in Canada – what do I take? Customs? Forbidden fruits & veggies? What if I get hurt? We answer all these questions and more!

Engine Maintenance: Diesel, gasoline, spark plugs, pistons, fuel mixtures, . . and how they all work together to get you where you're going.

Instructor Development (ID): Want to teach a course? We'll show you how! Open only to members.

Marine Electrical Systems (MES): There is one system on the boat and one that you plug into at the dock, which is which? Marine Communications Systems (MCS): It can be a matter of life or death to be able to communicate with the first responders. We teach you how to make a SOS call and more. Electronic Navigation Systems (ENS):

Radar for Boaters: The systems used to navigate by on the boat are changing as we speak. Learn now before they change.

Sail: What are all those lines and gadgets for? Are you sure the wind will blow me where I want to go?

Weather: Look to the clouds, wind and temperature for safe boating weather.

America's Boating Club of Snohomish County BACK IN THE BOAT SHOW AGAIN!!!

Back in the Boat Show again...finally we were able to do a Boating Safety 4 Kids Seminar at the Seattle Boat Show on February 3, 2024. My regular crew was unable to help this time, so it was time to recruit some new helpers.

Joining us this time were Danny Daniels and Claire Greer from Everett and Nancy and Geoff Ringstad from Tacoma Squadron. Alashia from the North West Marine Trade Association, set us up as the first seminar in a location much closer to the boats. We had plenty of time to set it up.

After Jim West and I unloaded the gear from his car and into the seminar classroom, all of us went around the Boat Show for over an hour inviting families to the seminar. We had about a dozen kids and more than that in adults. When asked who had their own life jackets, all in attendance raised their hands. That's never happened in all the years we have taught the seminar.

We taught the "Life Jacket Style Show" and the game "It's in the Box". "Life Jacket Style Show" teaches the RIGHT SIZE, FIT, COLOR AND CONDITION of the life jacket. "It's In the Box" teaches why it is important to wear your life jacket all the time in the boat, because you never know when there will be an emergency.

At the end, the kids put their hands in 42-degree water to buckle and un-buckle the life jacket buckles. They all received a certificate of participation in Boating Safety 4 Kids and a PFD Puzzle Story Book and crayons. The parents received a letter from PFD Seagull and a rack card from our squadron.




